Strategy Suggestion

Ask questions calling for an answer that will show knowledge of a word's meaning:

- **Q:** If you accused someone of being dishonest, what would you want to do to make that statement *believable*?
- **A:** Add facts (such as the person admitted to lying) or solid examples (such as the person lied about his age, which was discovered when his ID was proved to be fake).

Word/Term	Part of Speech	Definition
believable	adj.	able to be believed, or accepted as honest and true
dramatize	v.	to act out in a play, a story presented by actors
judgment	n.	the ability to make good decisions
reputation	n.	the common opinion that people have about a person, group, or thing
rumor	n.	a piece of information passed from one person to another without any proof that it is true (rumors)
spread	v.	to make widely known
working relationship	n. phr.	the way in which people talk to and behave with each other at work (working relationships)
